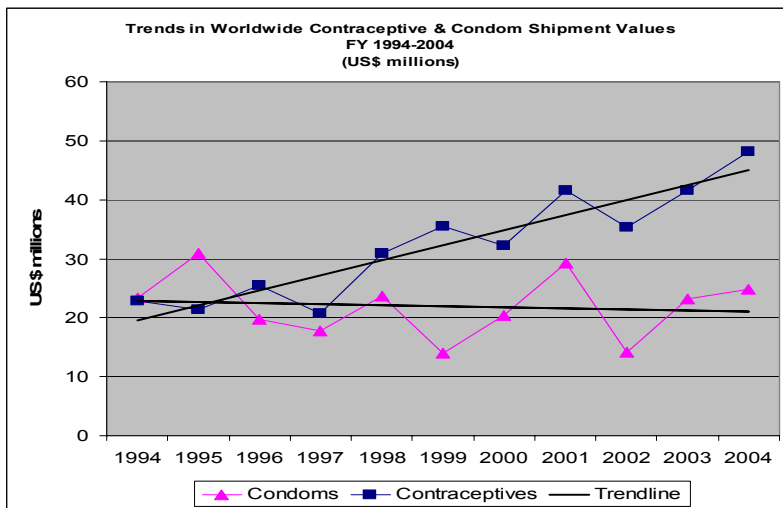
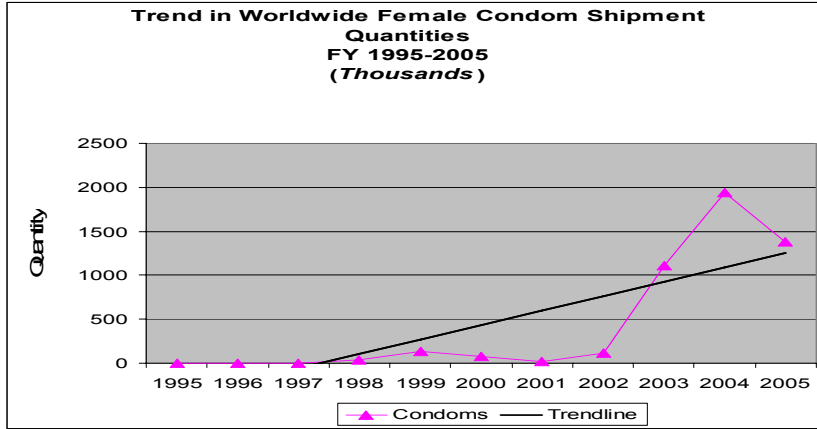
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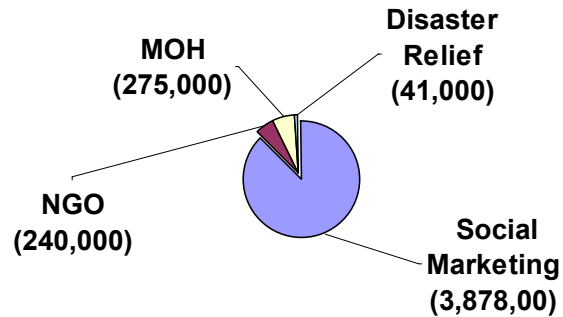


USAID PROCUREMENT

- support pre-dates purchase
- initial purchase for research
and introduction
- multi-year central contract
begins in 2003

DECISION-MAKING: **PROCESS**

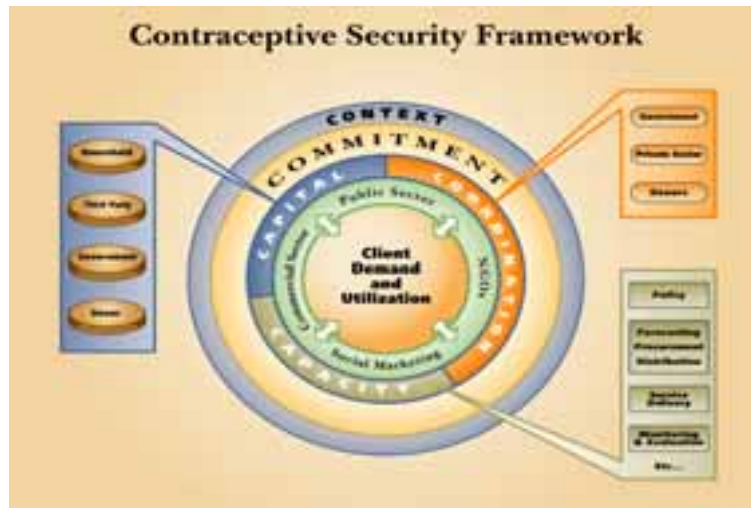
- product/client research

HOW WILL WE MEASURE IMPACT ?

- strategies and coordinating bodies in countries
- countries using WB/SWAp/PRSP credits to finance supplies and systems
- more countries allocating their own revenues for commodities
- increased private sector participation



- better donor planning of resource allocation and shipment decisions
- better targeting of public subsidies
- lower stock-out rates at service delivery points
- increased contraceptive prevalence and reduced inequities in access and use re supplies
